



## Visa for skilled workers holding a university degree/ EU Blue Card (Section 18b (2) Residence Act)

### Basic information

- Please see basic information on applying for a visa on our website
- The German mission is only competent should you have your permanent residence in Tanzania
- Documents not in the German language must be submitted with a certified German translation. A translation of the personal data page of the passport is, however, not required.
- Certificates, diplomas, etc. must be presented in the original with apostille/legalization. Your original documents will be returned to you once your application has been processed.
- The visa must, where applicable, be approved by the Federal Employment Agency and the competent foreigners authority. The visa can only be issued when these approvals have been received.
- **Processing time is as a rule ca. one week** but can take longer in individual cases.
- Flight reservations are not required to apply for a visa – please only book when you have received your visa and refrain from booking before.
- The mission abroad reserves the right to request further documents at all times.
- Missing documentation delays the procedure and can result in your application being rejected.
- **Please do not contact the mission abroad to check the status of your application during the normal processing period.** Such inquiries are extremely time-consuming for the visa section and can thus not be answered.

### General information

As a *skilled worker with a university degree recognised in Germany*, you will be issued with an EU Blue Card if the employment you want to take up matches your professional qualifications and you can present a contract of employment certifying a gross annual salary of at least 58,400 € in 2023 (for STEM occupations - scientists, mathematicians, engineers, doctors and IT specialists - at least 45,552 €).

In 2023, The minimum salary requirements are: --> 45.552€ annually/3.796,-€ monthly for scientists, mathematicians, engineers, doctors and IT specialists (so-called STEM occupations) and --> 58.400 € annually/ 4.866,67 monthly for all other occupations.

<input type="checkbox"/> Proof of adequate health insurance cover If as an employee you are subject to mandatory statutory health insurance, you must bear in mind that this insurance can only begin when you take up residence in Germany and enter into employment. If you enter Germany beforehand, private health insurance must be taken out for the period prior to employment beginning and prior to being eligible for statutory health insurance. In its terms and conditions, travel health insurance can exclude protection if a long-term or permanent stay is planned. So-called incoming travel insurance can also contain such exclusions.
