

Visa for skilled workers with vocational/professional training qualification

(Section 18a Residence Act)

Basic information

- Please see basic information on applying for a visa on our website. Applications can only be submitted via the <u>Consular Services Portal</u>.
- Documents not in the German language must be submitted with a certified German translation. A
 translation of the personal data page of the passport is, however, not required.
- The German mission is only competent should you have your permanent residence in Tanzania
- Certificates, diplomas, etc. must be presented in the original with apostille/legalisation.
- The visa must be approved by the Federal Employment Agency and, where applicable, the competent foreigners authority in Germany. The visa can only be issued when these approvals have been received.
- Processing time is generally six weeks but can take longer in individual cases.
- Flight reservations are not required to apply for a visa please only book when you have received your visa.
- The mission abroad reserves the right to request further documents.
- Missing documentation delays the procedure and can result in your application being rejected.
- Please do not contact the mission abroad to check the status of your application during the normal processing period. Such inquiries are extremely time-consuming for the visa section and can thus not be answered.

General information

To apply for a Visa for **skilled workers with professional/vocational training** you will need:

- a vocational/professional training comparable to German standards (please note that there are university degrees that are recognised as vocational training in Germany)
- qualified employment in Germany (not necessarily appropriate to the qualification, in case you work in a regulated profession, for instance health profession, a professional licence is mandatory
- Specific job offer from an employer in Germany for a qualified position. Auxiliary tasks will not be sufficient
- if you are 45 years or older and your annual gross salary is less than EUR 53.130,- (in 2025) you will need to prove adequate insurance for retirement
