# Visa for Internship

## (Section 16 ff. Residence Act)

## **Basic information**

- Possible reference to basic information on applying for a visa, for example, on website.
- Please provide all documents with the original and one copy, non-German/English documents need to be accompanied by a certified translation, all Tanzanian documents issued by the state need to be accompanied by a legalization
- Documents not in the German language must be submitted with a certified German translation. A translation of the personal data page of the passport is, however, not required.
- Certificates, diplomas, etc. must be presented in the original with apostille/legalisation.
- Processing time is as a rule ca. eight weeks, but can take longer in individual cases.
- Flight reservations are not required to apply for a visa please only book when you have received your visa.
- The mission abroad reserves the right to request further documents.
- Missing documentation delays the procedure and can result in your application being rejected.
- Please do not contact the mission abroad to check the status of your application during the normal processing period. Such inquiries are extremely time-consuming for the visa section and can thus not be answered.

## **General information**

To meet the requirements for internship visa you will generally need to provide the following:

- Proof that you earn the German minimum wage
- Proof of your enrolment in a university degree or other professional training
- Your internship contract (maximum of 6 months) with a German institution corresponding to your qualifications
- Consent from the German Federal Agency for Employment
- The German institution commits itself in writing to cover your costs of living and travel costs to your country of origin in case of your illegal residence. This commitment applies for up to six months following the end of the internship.

Use the following checklist to make sure your application documents are complete and bring a print out of this information sheet to your appointment.

	Signed internship agreement (original and one copy)
	The contract needs to contain certain information: description of the aim and duration of
	internship; role and duties of the intern; working hours; nature of contract and payment
	Consent from the German Federal Agency for Employment as obtained by the internship provider
	(original and one copy)
	Proof of qualification: Proof of enrolment in university degree of other professional training
	CV and motivational letter
	Written commitment by internship provider to cover costs of living and travel back to your country
	of origin in case of your illegal residence up to six months after the end of the internship agreement
	(original and one copy)
	Proof of adequate financial means
	Financing
	To stay in Germany the applicant must have at their disposal <b>at least 855,- € net/ 1.030,-€ gross</b>
	<b>per month</b> if the internship is voluntary and according to §§ 16a und 16e AufenthG or if the
	internship is a requirement within the studies <b>at least 992,- € net per months.</b> Proof of these
	financial means can be provided through the internship agreement. The minimum wage must be
	provided. If the internship agreement does not amount to the required financial means, a formal
	letter of obligation by a host can proof that your living costs are covered. Otherwise you can
	proof that you have enough financing by providing porof of an existing blocked account.
	Proof of adequate health insurance cover
	If as an employee you are subject to mandatory statutory health insurance, you must bear in
	mind that this insurance can only begin when you take up residence in Germany and enter into
	employment. If you enter Germany beforehand, private health insurance must be taken out for
	the period prior to employment beginning and prior to being eligible for statutory health
	insurance. In its terms and conditions, travel health insurance can exclude protection if a long-
	term or permanent stay is planned. So-called incoming travel insurance can also contain such
	exclusions. Further information concerning this topic can be found on our website.
